1. Felipe Carrillo Puerto and Cancun, Mexico
2. Maracay, Venezuela

PARTICIPANTS:

1. Six students, six O.D.'s and 2 ancillary personnel involved in Mexico
2. Eleven students, seven O.D.'S and 2 ancillary personnel in Venezuela

ITINERARY:

The trip to Mexico started in Felipe Carrillo Puerto where 980 patients were given eye examinations and glasses as needed. After 2 ½ days VOSH moved on to Cancun for the remainder of the trip. In Cancun, 989 patients were seen. There were a few days available to explore Mexico's ruins and splendid beaches.

The trip to Venezuela was based in Maracay. Fourteen different communities based in people to our makeshift clinic. A total of 2,000 patients were seen. After 4 ½ days, VOSH members were able to enjoy the beautiful beaches and mountain scenery.

EYE CARE FOR THE HOMELESS:

There were many exams given during the 1990-91 school year. Donations of cash and frames enabled VOSH to provide free eye glasses there patients.

SCREENING:

Many glaucoma and preschool screenings were done during the year. The majority of these were done in conjunction with the LIONS CLUB; others were done at private companies.

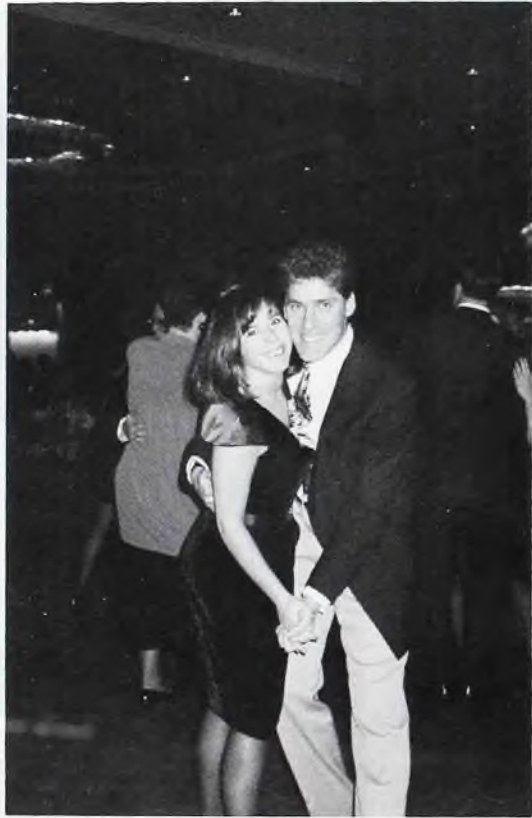

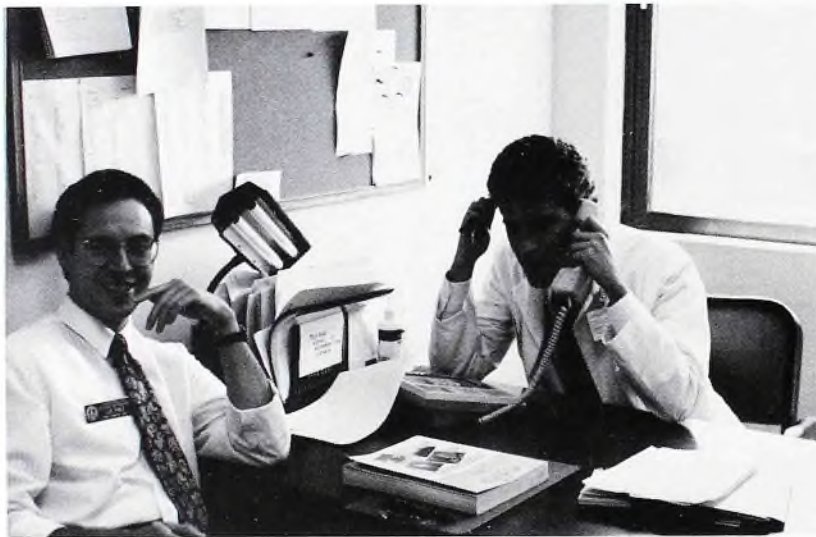

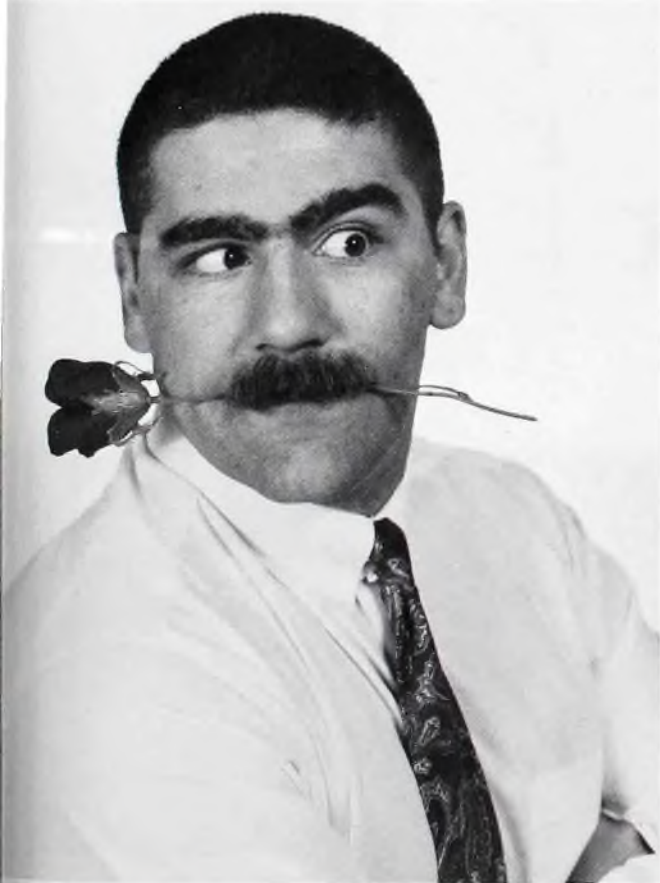

Code Of Ethics

*It Shall Be The Ideal, The Resolve, And The Duty Of The Members
Of The American Optometric Association:*

TO KEEP the visual welfare of the patient upper-most at all times;

TO PROMOTE in every possible way, in collaboration with This Association, better care of the visual needs of mankind;

TO ENHANCE continuously their educational and technical proficiency to the end that their patients shall receive the benefits of all acknowledged improvements in visual care;

TO SEE THAT no person shall lack of visual care, regardless of his financial status;

TO ADVISE the patient whenever consultation with an optometric colleague or reference for other professional care seems advisable;

TO HOLD in professional confidence all information concerning a patient and to use such data only for the benefit of the patient;

TO CONDUCT themselves as exemplary citizens;

TO MAINTAIN their offices and their practices in keeping with professional standards;

TO PROMOTE and maintain cordial and unselfish relationships with members of their own profession and of other professions for the exchange of information to the advantage of mankind.
