The Class of 1995 would like to dedicate this book in memory of Dr. John Carter. We admired his immense knowledge and his joy of teaching. He was a brilliant and humble man who always had a smile and a greeting for everyone. He was greatly respected by all who knew him. He was a Professor of Physiological Optics and taught the Class of 1995 courses including Ocular Myology, Sensory and Motor Anomalies and Ocular Pharmacology. Dr. Carter passed on while teaching optometry in South Africa on July 9, 1994.

Dr. Carter received his O.D. degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1953 and was valedictorian of his class. He received his Masters degree in 1959 and Ph.D. degree in Physiological Optics in 1962 from Indiana University. Prior to beginning his academic career, Professor Carter was in private practice and in the United States Air Force. In 1962, he joined the faculty of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry and came to the New England College of Optometry in 1970. He had a long distinguished career in optometry and optometric education.

Dr. Carter was a member of the American Academy of Optometry, the American Optometric Association, the Massachusetts Society of Optometrists, the New England Council of Optometrists, and was on the editorial board of the *New England Journal of Optometry*. Professor Carter had also served as the President of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry, been a member of the Editorial Council of the *American Journal of Optometry* and an advisor to the Retinal and Choroidal Diseases Panel of the National Eye Institute.

Dr. Carter was honored by the graduating class with the Foster Namias Award for excellence in academic teaching five times in the past seven years. Professor Carter set a standard as an educator and colleague which will serve as a benchmark for others for many years.



As you begin your career, the editors would like to leave you with this thought, John F. Kennedy once said:


*"Some men see things as they are, and ask why?

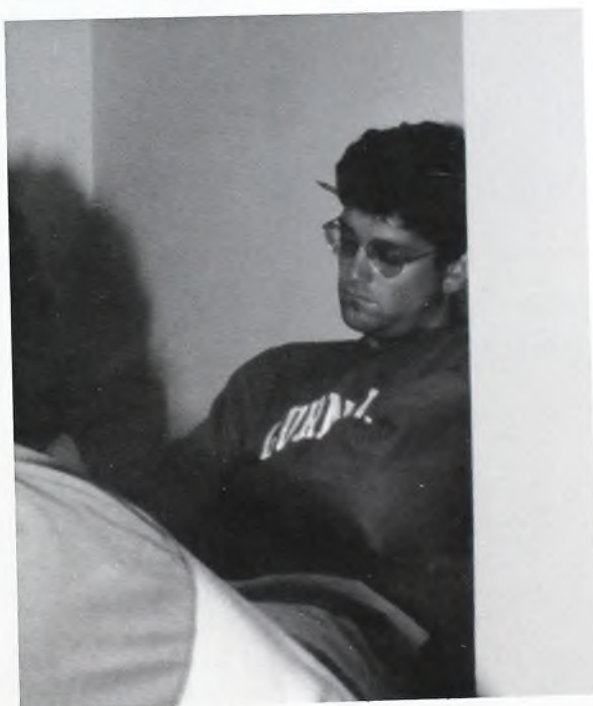
